Fluffy Slime

Description:

This soft, stretchy fluffy slime is a favorite sensory activity for kids and teens. Made with simple ingredients, it has a light, marshmallow-like texture and can be customized with colors, glitter, or small mix-ins for endless creative fun.

About 3 cups

INGREDIENTS

Fluffy Slime

- 1 cup white school glue
- 3 cups shaving cream
- Food coloring, optional
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1½ tablespoons saline contact solution, added slowly (must contain boric acid and sodium borate)

RHINO TIP

Different brands of contact solution and glue can affect the texture. Add the contact solution slowly—a little goes a long way, and you can always add more if needed. This slime is intended for play only and is not edible.



STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS



Add the glue.

Pour the glue into a large mixing bowl.



Add the shaving cream.

Add the shaving cream and stir until fully combined. Add a few drops of food coloring if desired.



Mix in the baking soda.

Stir in the baking soda until evenly incorporated.



Activate the slime.

Add the contact solution slowly while stirring continuously. The mixture will begin pulling away from the sides of the bowl.



Knead until stretchy.

Knead the slime with your hands for several minutes until it becomes smooth, fluffy, and stretchy. Add a few extra drops of contact solution only if needed.



Store for later.

Store the slime in an airtight container or zip-top bag when not in use.

TIPS & VARIATIONS



1. Glitter Slime – Add fine craft glitter for sparkling slime that catches the light.



2. Rainbow Slime – Divide the slime into portions and color each one differently.



3. Confetti Slime – Mix in foam beads or colorful sprinkles for extra texture and visual interest.



4. Glow Slime – Add a small amount of glow pigment or glow paint for nighttime fun.



5. Stretch Challenge – See how far the slime can stretch without breaking and compare different recipes.
